My name is Stephanie Politi and I have been the Director of Youth of Youth Ministry and Confirmation Preparation at St Rose of Lima Parish in East Hanover, NJ for the past eleven years.

The reaction at our Parish each time they come has been the biggest response of any other speakers I have worked with in my tenure here. The students are mesmerized and ask sensitive and thought provoking questions, and continue to discuss with their classes for weeks to come. The parents have written me notes and called me, thanking me for bringing the Streiters to us. In short, the Streiters have made an indelible impact on hundreds of people, just at our small parish in an only a once a year, 90 minute visit. This year when they come, our Pastor is personally encouraging our parish bereavement group to attend, as he feels they will benefit from the inspiration and hope the Streiters invoke.
